### Program Dates and Requirements

**Tuesday, June 18 - Wednesday, July 3, 2023**

Check-in day: June 17 / Check-out day: July 4

In order to apply to SSIP 2024, you must be:

- 1) a female undergraduate or graduate student currently enrolled in one of SWU's partner institutions.
- 2) nominated by your home institution by February 20th.
- 3) fluent in English to participate and engage in lectures and group work.



### Two Concentrated Courses

#### Japan Studies

1 SWU Credit  
(15 hours: Lecture)

Omnibus-style course consists of lectures and activities to learn about various aspects of Japanese culture and society.



#### Cross-Cultural Workshop

2 SWU Credits  
(22.5 hours: Workshops and Presentation)

Collaborative learning project with Japanese students in an interactive workshop.

## Course Details

### Japan Studies

"Japan Studies" is an omnibus-style course which covers various areas of Japanese culture and society, both traditional and contemporary. The course is designed for students to learn about Japan through lectures on different topics and also to engage in activities and site visits to experience Japanese culture.

1. Class Hours: 90 mins x 8 sessions
2. Topics (subject to change)

Japanese Culture (Traditional / Pop Culture), Design, Japanese Food Culture, Business in Japan, Kabuki, Film, Obento, Women in Japan, etc.

3. Activities (subject to change)

Tea Ceremony, Calligraphy, Asakusa Visit, Ghibli Museum Visit, Kabuki Viewing, etc.

### Cross-Cultural Workshop

"Cross-Cultural Workshop" aims to improve students' cross-cultural understanding and intercultural communication skills through collaborative project with Japanese students. It provides an opportunity to work with Japanese students as well as other students with diverse backgrounds. Based on a specific theme, students will exchange ideas, engage in collaborative research and discussions, and give a presentation.

1. Class Hours: 90 mins x 15 sessions
2. Workshop Contents:

Ice-breaking intercultural activities, team building activity, group discussions, data collection and analysis, three-night CCW camp, presentation preparation, final presentation, etc.
