- Intensive English Program: Juniata provides English as a Second Language (ESL) courses for credit and an ESL tutoring program. You'll have the support you need to succeed in your academic and personal goals.
- Location: Juniata is located in the safe, town of Huntingdon, Pennsylvania, a quiet and powerful place, where you'll have an authentic U.S. experience in a friendly, active community. It's located on a train route that connects students with nearby cities. We are three hours from Philadelphia, Pittsburgh, Washington, D.C., and Baltimore. New York City and Boston are easily reached by train. Juniata frequently provides transportation to the local airport at key times. On campus, there's plenty to do—Juniata has more than 100 student clubs. Students can create their own organizations as well.





Student Opportunities

Experience: Gain hands-on experience using **scientific instrumentation**, through distinctive programs like Language in Motion, and in internships at typical work settings. Traditionally at U.S. universities, only graduate students are permitted to use advanced equipment. At Juniata, you can **gain experience in lab research as an undergraduate** in many fields. Not interested in science? Exhibit your art in Juniata's Museum of Art. Present social science, humanities, or business papers at the College's **Liberal Arts Symposium** held each April.

Campus Community: Juniata students are fun, smart, and focused. Among our beloved campus traditions, several celebrate our global community. Juniata's clubs and organizations range from athletics, like rugby and frisbee, and advocacy clubs, like Colleges Against Cancer, to discipline-specific groups, like Chemistry Club and Art Alliance. Several internationally themed clubs exist at Juniata, including Japanese Club, Spanish Club, and International Cooking Club.

Friendship Families: At Juniata, you'll stay in a residence hall, but you have the option to also have a host family. Juniata arranges friendship families for international students who want to establish a bond with an American family. Friendship families may provide meals at their home, trips to nearby activities, and the expected home-away-from-home relationship.

Housing: Almost all students at Juniata live in residence halls. These buildings contain double-occupancy rooms (which you'll share with a roommate of your gender) that feature beds, dressers, and plugins for small refrigerators, microwaves, and computers. Dorms also feature shared bathrooms. (For food, you can purchase a meal plan and use it to eat in Juniata's dining hall or several cafés throughout campus where coffee, sandwiches, and salads are served.)
